U.S. Says Las Vegas Is Preferred Casino Destination: Atlantic City Places Third

Given the choice, more folks would prefer to spend a couple of days in Las Vegas than any other casino destination in America. According to a national telephone poll by Fairleigh Dickinson University's PublicMind[™], 47% of adults nationwide make Las Vegas their top choice. Many fewer would make New Orleans (10%) or Atlantic City (8%) their first choice. Reno (5%) and St. Louis (4%) rounded out the list.

Atlantic City does much better as a second choice but not any better than other picks. Asked for their second choice, Atlantic City garners 23%, statistically the same as New Orleans (22%) and Las Vegas (21%), while Reno jumps up to 18%. The only city that doesn't do well in a second round is St. Louis (5%), home of riverfront gambling.

"Atlantic City is really in a national, if not international, competition for visitors," said Professor Donald Hoover, who teaches in FDU's International School of Hospitality and Tourism Management, following a career working for Tropicana in Atlantic City. "Businesses and planners need to start thinking and acting like they're in a national market."

Those who pick Atlantic City first or second tend to say its best characteristic is the beach (26%), followed distantly by the casinos (11%). They also suggest it is someplace new to go (8%), and some cite the entertainment (6%).

As for those who do not pick Atlantic City either as a first or a second choice, their reasons are scattered. One in ten (11%) simply say they, "like other destinations better" and one in ten (10%) say "it's too far." One in four (24%) don't give a reason.

"The fact that people don't offer a clear response as to why they do not choose Atlantic City as a destination is really good news," said Hoover. "It suggests that Atlantic City still has the opportunity to create a positive image."

Just 4% say the city is dirty or run down and just 3% say it's because they don't like New Jersey.

Also good news for Atlantic City is that among residents of the Northeastern states, it places a strong second behind Las Vegas: 22% compared to 39% for Las Vegas. But outside the Northeast, Atlantic City drops into single digits as a first choice.

As a second-choice destination A.C. does well in the Northeast with 25%, but Atlantic City does best in the West where, on the other side of the Rocky Mountains, 30% make A.C. a second pick.

"For years, Atlantic City has been scouring the nearest backyards for customers," added Hoover. "It's time the city reached a lot further."

The Fairleigh Dickinson University poll of 711 adults nationwide was conducted by telephone using both landlines and cell phones from March 21, 2011, through March 27, 2011, and has a margin of error of +/-4 percentage points.

Background Memo and Tables

The most recent survey by Fairleigh Dickinson University's PublicMind was conducted by telephone from March 21, 2011, through March 27, 2011, using a randomly selected national sample of 711 adults permanently resident in the United States. The margin of error for a sample of 711 randomly selected respondents is +/- 4 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups is larger and varies by the size of that subgroup. Survey results are also subject to non-sampling error. This kind of error, which cannot be measured, arises from a number of factors including, but not limited to, non-response (eligible individuals refusing to be interviewed), question wording, the order in which questions are asked, and variations among interviewers. PublicMind interviews are conducted by Opinion America of Cedar Knolls, NJ, with professionally trained interviewers using a CATI (Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing) system. Random selection is achieved by computerized random-digit dialing. This technique gives every person with a land-line phone number (including those with unlisted numbers) an equal chance of being selected. Landline households are supplemented with a separate, randomly selected sample of cell-phone-only-households, interviewed in the same time frame. The total combined sample is mathematically weighted to match known demographics of age, race and gender among the voting population.
